P R O C E E D I N G S

1
2 THE STAFF: Commissioners and guests in the
3 gallery, please silent all electronic devices.

4 All Commissioners, please indicate your
5 presence.

6 The form is present, Mr. Chair.

7 MR. CHAIRMAN: Thank you.

8 The Commission will be in order.

9 Commissioners and guests, please rise for the
10 opening prayer, for a moment of silence for the
11 tragic events in Las Vegas. Thank you.

12 (Prayer/Moment of Silence.)

13 MR. CHAIRMAN: Please remain standing for the
14 Pledge of Allegiance to be lead by this afternoon
15 -- this morning by Commissioner Thurlow-Lippisch.

16 (Pledge of Allegiance.)

17 MR. CHAIRMAN: Please be seated.

18 We will now continue with the daily order of
19 business: Communications. There are no
20 communications.

21 Introduction of proposals. There are none.

22 Report of committees. We have a report from
23 the Rules and Administration Committee.

24 Commissioner Cerio, you are recognized to explain
25 the report.

1 MR. CERIO: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

2 Good morning, Commissioners. The Rules and
3 Administration Committee met on August 9th and
4 gave recommendations on several deadlines for
5 consideration by the full Commission. Following
6 the cancellation of the commissioners' September
7 18th through 19th meetings due to Hurricane Irma,
8 the rules committee met again on September 25th to
9 revise the deadlines.

10 So much of the state clearly was impacted by
11 the hurricane. Many people were recovering -- are
12 still recovering, so basically the Commission --
13 or the Rules Committee thought it was appropriate
14 to push back some of these deadlines to give
15 Floridians more time and opportunity to
16 participate. Clearly the public's input is
17 critical to this process, and it was just the
18 right thing to do.

19 So each of you commissioners have a copy of
20 the report on your desk. The report recommends a
21 public proposal submission deadline of October
22 6th. The old deadline was September 22nd. This
23 is the proposed deadline for members of the public
24 to submit constitutional amendments for you as
25 commissioners to move to sponsor in accordance

1 with Rule 3.3.

2 The report also recommends a commissioner
3 draft request deadline of October 17th. That is
4 the deadline for commissioners to submit a request
5 to have staff assist in drafting exact language of
6 a proposals or maybe it's just a concept at that
7 point. The key is, the deadline is October 17th
8 if you would like staff to assist you in drafting
9 your proposal. Any proposals submitted after the
10 proposed deadline will be filed exactly as the
11 commissioner submitted them without any technical
12 or substantive revisions by staff.

13 Additionally, the report recommends a
14 commissioner proposal filing deadline of October
15 31. This is the final deadline for commissioners
16 to file a proposed constitutional amendment for
17 consideration by the full Commission.

18 And finally, the report recommends a deadline
19 for filing amendments to proposals being heard in
20 a committee. The recommended amendment filing
21 deadline is 24 hours before the notice hour of the
22 meeting. And just to be clear, this
23 recommendation only applies at the Committee
24 level. It does not apply to amendments for full
25 commission meetings.

1 Mr. Chairman, I move Commission accept this
2 report in its entirety and adopt the deadlines
3 contained therein.

4 MR. CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mr. Cerio.

5 Are there any questions on the report?

6 Is there any debate?

7 Seeing none. Unlock the board. All
8 Commissioners proceed to vote on the Committee
9 report.

10 Lock the board, please. Announce the vote.

11 THE STAFF: Thirty yeas; zero nays, Mr.
12 Chair.

13 MR. CHAIRMAN: Thank you.

14 The report is adopted.

15 Commissioners, I will now open the floor for
16 any commissioner wishing to move a file and
17 sponsor a public proposal in accordance with Rule
18 3.3.

19 Upon an affirmative vote of 10 commissioners
20 the public proposal will be filed as a
21 commissioner proposal with the moving commissioner
22 as sponsored.

23 Public participation is critical to the CRC
24 process, and we are greatly to Floridians who have
25 taken the time to submit proposals. We review

1 these public proposals and comments we receive.

2 It is clear that Floridians share many of the same
3 interests in similar subject areas.

4 Several commissioners observe the strong
5 interest during the process of filing their own
6 proposals based on the public input we have
7 received. This is a collegial process that allows
8 every commission the opportunity to identify good
9 ideas put forward by Floridians that he or she
10 would like to carry through this process.

11 Votes taken on these motions are to allow a
12 commissioner to file the proposal. These are not
13 votes on the substance of any individual proposal.
14 We will consider each motion without debate and go
15 directly to a vote. I ask commissioners to
16 refrain from discussing the merits of any
17 individual proposal.

18 Are there any motions to sponsor public
19 proposals?

20 Commissioner Plymale is acknowledged.

21 MS. PLYMALE: I propose to sponsor 700396,
22 which is titled "Closing the Write-in Loophole.
23 It's sponsored by former Senator Dave Aronberg
24 who's currently the State Attorney in West Palm
25 Beach.

1 MR. CHAIRMAN: Please unlock the board. All
2 commissioners proceed to vote.

3 Please lock the board. Announce the vote.

4 THE STAFF: Twenty-seven yeas; three nays,
5 Mr. Chair.

6 MR. CHAIRMAN: Proposal carries. Thank you.

7 Anyone else?

8 Commissioner Timmann.

9 MS. TIMMANN: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

10 I would like to move for public proposal
11 700202, which deletes the provision in Article 10
12 Section 19 related to high-speed ground
13 transportation. And I request that pursuant to
14 CRC Rule 3.3. I would appreciate the vote of at
15 least nine members in support of moving this
16 proposal forward to delete a revision that has
17 already been repealed by the voters. Thank you.

18 MR. CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Commissioner.

19 Please unlock the board and vote. Thank you.

20 Have all commissioners voted? Have all
21 commissioners voted?

22 The answer is -- lock the board.

23 THE STAFF: Thirty yeas; zero nays, Mr.
24 Chair.

25 MR. CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Commissioner

1 Timmann. The motion is adopted.

2 Are there any other proposals?

3 Mr. Smith.

4 MR. SMITH: Thank you, Mr. Chair.

5 I noticed only two of the public proposals
6 were taken up today. I know Floridians are
7 watching this process. I just wanted to make a
8 quick point if that's possible?

9 MR. CHAIRMAN: Please go ahead.

10 MR. SMITH: A proposal that Senator Joyner
11 and I put forth, the Automatic Restoration of
12 Rights, was offered by many Floridians and put in
13 as public proposals. We're not taking it up. We
14 filed it as commissioners. But that is the
15 essence of about 12 different public proposals.

16 I just want the public to know that we are
17 looking at these and we are taking them seriously
18 and looking at them. So the one that we filed is
19 in essence 12 different ones that were filed by
20 citizens through the Internet and also when they
21 came to our meetings.

22 So just because we only took up two today as
23 commissioners, a lot of the things that we're
24 filing and especially the one that Senator Joyner
25 and I filed is the essence of the hard working and

1 intellect of Floridians. I just wanted to put
2 that on the record; that our proposal is the
3 essence of about 12 of these that are there.

4 MR. CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Commissioner Smith.

5 Is there another commissioner that would like
6 to speak?

7 Seeing none.

8 We need to continue the process. We have
9 about 30 days -- a little less than 30 days to
10 represent Floridians in the open process. Whether
11 they're public or you take them as your own, as
12 long as they get to us, we can act on them. Thank
13 you.

14 The full commission will be meeting again on
15 October 17th when commissioners will have another
16 opportunity to sponsor public proposals that have
17 been submitted.

18 Matters on reconsideration. There are none
19 before the Commission today.

20 Special order calendar. There is no special
21 order calendar today.

22 Unfinished business. There is no unfinished
23 business.

24 Corrections to the journal. There are none.

25 Are there any announcements?

1 Does any commissioner have any announcements?¹¹
2 Seeing none. Commissioner Cerio, you are
3 recognized for a motion.
4 MR. CERIO: Mr. Chairman, I move that we
5 stand adjourned.
6 MR. CHAIRMAN: So moved. Thank you very much
7 for your participation.
